Indeed, the Foreign Missions Committee Have recognized this by appointing Drs. Anderson and Landsborough To the joint conduct of the work during our absence on furlough. It is True that for lack of funds the Committee has not yet seen its way to Grant this plainly needed help, but it is unthinkable that our Church will Consent to cripple a work which has grown under God's blessing in the Was in which the Church desired that it might grow, and that it should Withdraw from the Formosan people the enjoyment, at Taiwan, of any Part of the boon on which they have learned increasingly to rely, and For which they have themselves done so much that, apart from the salary Of the medical missionary, this great hospital work has been for tears Absolutely no burden to the mission funds. Surely the Church will pro-Vide what is required for another medical missionary. We make bold Earnestly to appeal for this help.

We have tried in the foregoing pages to tell something of the success That has attended the work of the hospital in Tainan. We cannot, how-Ever, blind our eyes to the fact that there is urgent need for improvement.
